historic 0 th wage settlement signed between consultative committee of FMRAI, representing sales promotion employees and M/SJohnson and Johnson on 21st February 2023 Cricket Mumbai Association Hall. The management was represented bv Mr. Sharthak Ranade, President. Tridib Adhikari, Associate Director, DarshikaKhare, H R RamajiShindhe, Manager and on behalf of FMRAI SoumitraMukhrjee, P Satvanarayana. P Satyanarayana, Krishnand, Anand VivekGodse, Kumar, KJha and Rakesh signed Sharma the settlement with S K Choudhury as witness. Thecharter of demands, placed on 4th December 2020, is effective from 1st Jan 2021 and will remain in force up to 30th June 2024. With an average benefit of Rs 5900 per

MSR per month, the workersat entry level will be eligible for a rise ofRs 4100 over and above existing pay and the maximum benefit will be up to Rs 34775 for those who are 35 yrs in service. In FDA. Rs 215 and 350 is added in two slabs after merging the existing VDA till the month of December. In VDA, Rs. 3.95 and 4.40 per point neutralisation Upward maintained. revision is maintained in all other components like HRA, Education allowance, LTA, Medical, Daily Allowance. Vehicle Maintenance Allowance and Business Communication Allowance. For Ex working Station kilometer fare also been increased to compensate the rise in fuel prices. All MSR's will be paid fixed Ex Gratia of Rs 16800 in lieu of bonus. All other existing benefits be continued as previous settlement.

Act (Bombay) rules1957 on 28 February at Mumbai.The average benefit of settlement would be Rs 5311 with a minimum benefit of Rs 3369 for an SPE completing 1 yr. of service and Rs 28392 for an employee of 36 years of service. As per practice 60 percent of the amount is included in wage part in the first year and the rest 40 percent (10% each in the rest 4 years) to be included into non-wage part.

EDITORIAL

Workers, Peasants determined to fight for reversal of pro corporate policies

now that the Modi Government has declared war against the working class of the country, the workers and the peasants. Never before in the history the independent India had the Indian working class, peasants the common people faced with such acute distress in their lives and livelihoods, as a direct fallout of the policies of the Government they chose to rule. The first thing that strikes us is the absurd accumulation of wealth in the hands of a few corporate friends of the government. The vast majority of people languish in abject poverty and the corporate cronies amass enormous wealth is reason enough for any sensible human being recoil in disgust. In 2022 total number of billionaires rose from 140 to 166. At the same time 1.7 million Indian died due to malnutrition. World Report Inequality observed that "India is among the most unequal countries in the world. with rising poverty and an 'affluent elite'." The unemployment rate is to the tune of 7.6%, an alltime high figure since many decades. Amidst general slowdown of the economy and a disastrous experience of the nation in terms of jobs and health during the pandemic, it was expected that the recent budget would contain directions for economic turnaround where jobs, protection of income, healthcare and social rights for large numbers of farmers and the working poor would get priority. But the budget contained none of the above. It appears as if Indian Government has decided that the poor people are actually a dispensable group for the nation.

Eager to please their business tycoon friends, the Union Government has let loose all kinds of tyranny to shackle the working class of the country. In this they have surpassed even the

British rulers who left India 70 years ago. Many of the Trade Union laws were actually enacted during the British era owing to massive movements of workers in the country. To enable reckless run of the corporate rulers, all rights of the workers have been planned to be snatched away by codifying the 44 labour This includes sector specific acts like The Sales promotion Employees (Conditions of Services) Act, 1976 and, The Working Journalists (Fixation of Rates of Wages) act, India already had a huge number of workers without any permanency of jobs and devoid of any social welfare measures. In future all jobs will turn out to be contractual in nature with the government eager to bring in Fixed term Employment. Thus, in future the right to form or continue with any kind of trade union or workers associations in the workplace will only be a daydream. The peasants in the country are also unprecedented attack by the Modi government. It was only because of the no holds barred fight that the peasants put up that the government shelved the plan to present the farming sector of the country to the hands of its corporate friends.

The Sales promotion Employees have seen spate of attacks during this regime unprecedented in the history profession. Terminations of jobs, arbitrary transfersand wage cuts are now rampant in the industry. Emboldened by clear anti-worker stand the government, the employers of the pharma industry hell bent to ignore unions. destrov Working conditions are in a total mess with the managements bringing in newer and newer working rules everyday bypassing the laws of the land and sometimes completely ignoring the agreed understandings with the union in this

regard. The future employment scenario in sales profession is dark too with many employers already bringing in FTE in the job of sales promotion of pharmaceutical products.

There are only two ways for the workers of the country now. Either go for complete surrender in front of the attacks or rise in unison together with other members of the working class and peasants of the country to protest, resist and reverse the disastrous policies of the Modi government. Our experience says that people's anger against the policies is growing day Mazdoor-The KisanSangharsh Rally on 5th September, 2018 was the biggest ever ofmobilisation workers and peasants in the national capital since independence. the intervening period workers the including sales promotion Employees have participated numerous rallies, dharnas and strikes against this government. It is about time that we march to Delhi once again to give decisive blow against the government policies which are doing immense harm to us. planning to turn us into twenty first century slaves of the corporate cronies. The Indian working class including sales promotion Employees have fought many brave battles. we have the capacity to turn the tide in our favour with total unity and dedication. We shall meet in Delhi shoulder to shoulder with our peasant brethren on the 5th of April. The danger is clear and present so the war is declared. Later on the delegates discussed on the reports placed by General Secretary and Treasurer. Over all 32 speakers from different state units, Thirteen All India Conveners from All India Councils and women delegate from Women subcommittee discussed on the report and placed their suggestions and recommendations. February, 9th 2022, a special note on current attacks on the SPEs and the resultant issues faced by fieldworkers placed by Sunil Kumar, Joint General Secretary FMRAI. After placement of the special note, all the General Council members along with the working committee members were divided in to 6 groups for elaborate discussion on content of the note. The secretariat members of FMRAI moderated the discussion. Later on a working group from each of the six groups prepared the summary report of the commission discussion which was placed by two speakers from each of the groups in the main session. Over all during the special session, all the members participated discussing special note and placed important suggestions on the issues and wavs to combat the problems. It was decided that a concrete note will be prepared by finalizing and incorporating all the suggestions by the working committee. ParthaRakshit. treasurer, **FMRAI** summed discussion on the special note. On the second dav evening the sub units having 1000 +membership were felicitated. 21 sub units have surpassed thousand

The pharma companies taking full advantage of the situation have not only introduced digitalization in sales promotion work but have also brought down relentless attacks on the sales promotion employees in various forms. repealing of SPE Act through introduction Labour Codes encouraged the employers particularly of the pharmaceutical industry to attack trade union and adopt hire and fire regime. The nature of onslaught differs from company to company according to their agenda, but the common issue is employers want fieldworkers to abide by their diktats at any cost. Union Budget 2023–24

A commitment to neo liberal economy

■ he Union Budget 2023-24 comes at a time when Indian economy slowed down before the advent of the pandemic, worsened during the 2 pandemic years and the post pandemic recovery adversely impacted by the global economic slowdown moving towards possible recession. Under these circumstances this should budget have addressed the central ofissues increasing people's purchasing power with generation and boosting the growth of domestic demand. but budget fails to meet the peoples' demand. On the contrary, it squeezes government expenditures to reduce the fiscal deficit while further concession to the rich. This comes at a time when Oxfam report shows that the richest 1 per cent in India have cornered 40.5 per cent of the wealth generated in the last 2 years. Thus, this budget will aggravate the economic The increase total government expenditure for 2023over the revised estimates for 2022-23 is a mere 7 per cent when the

increase in GDP over the

same period is estimated to be 10.5 per cent. Thus, as a percentage is a of GDP there reduction in government expenditure. This "peoplecalled centric" budget only mounts further attacks thelivelihoods the vast majority our population. Spending on schemes and programmes that provide direct economic people benefit to been curtailed abruptly. Key problems confronting the people have been either ignored or indifferently dealt These include intense unemployment, especially among vouth. For the past about 41 months, unemployment rate has been hovering around 7 per cent, often even higher, according CMIE survey data. When the unemployment rate is at a historic high the budget proposes 33 per cent cut in MNREGS and the total cut in major subsidies is about 28 per cent compared to last vear's revised estimates. This is surely going to have a cascading effect on prices which would trigger inflationary due to rise pressure input prices and also agriculture transportation costs.

food subsidy is by 31 per cent cut and the allocation for rural development has also been slashed. The cuts in rural housing scheme, Swachh Bharat Mission and welfare schemes means that the jobs created under these would also be lost. Practically no increase in funds ICDS means that the 2.4 lakh vacancies in posts sanctioned anganwadi workers and helpers would continue also The remain vacant. tax exemption limit has been raised from Rs. 5 to 7 lakh providing some relief to salaried sections However, this will be more than offset by inflation and cuts in social sector expenditure making people spend more on essential services including health and education. importantly in India those who pay income tax and file returns constitute only 5.9 per cent of the total 136 crore population. More than 94 per cent of the total population has nothing to do with income tax regime change, while they have to bear the brunt of subsidy cut and higher prices which the budget proposes.

Show causes against E-Pharmacies

n the first major crackdown on the fast expanding market of online medicine sales, the government has issued show-cause notices to 20 leading e-pharmacies for the sale and stocking of drugs in contravention of the existing laws. The Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO). has issued orders to take action against such illegal E-pharmacies. Drug General Controller of India (DCGI) V.G. Somani, who heads CDSCO. has written to drug controllers in states and union territories to take "necessary actions" on the "copy of orders" passed by the Delhi High Court on 12th December 2018 with respect to online sales of medicines. A copy of the letter is also marked to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, the parent CDSCO. ministry ofThe notices issued by the Drugs Controller General of India, direct e-pharmacy giants, including Amazon. Tata 1 mg, PharmEasy, Flipkart, Apollo etc to reply why they should not face action under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940. They are yet to respond on the show

cause notices. The expansion of online pharmacies has raised serious concerns patient data privacy and sale of contraband products. Government estimates also suggest online pharmacies could wipe out 30% of India's existing retail shops. Rule 64 of the Drugs Rules, 1945, states that for the sale, stocking, exhibition or offer for sale and distribution of any drug, a licence is required from the concerned state authority and conditions of the licence are to be complied with by the licensee.

The AIOCD, representing around 8.5L chemists druggists, have urged Union minister of health and family welfare to take steps against e-pharmacies to curtail the illegal sale of Rx drugs on internet. On July 5, 2022 AIOCD urged health ministry stop operation of e-pharmacies in the country in the wake of seizure of fake drugs worth crores of rupees by the STF from online

players in Uttarakhand. In 2018 The AIOCD went on a nationwide oneday strike on September 27, against regularising e-pharmacies.The discounts offered are nothing but predatory pricing to drive the small retail out of the market for monopoly in the long Indiscriminate sale of

habit forming drugs and antibiotic resistance are serious issues related to the online sales of drugs in India which is hazardous to public health. The Competition Commission of India in its market study mentions that the main concerns emerging E-Pharmacies, out of includes the threat of substitution, not backed by prescription, patient data, prescription privacy, and the risks ofself-medication. FMRAI has been raising concerns on the E-pharmacy's access to customer data, especially sex, location. epidemiological profile, and medication history. FMRAI have also raised concerns on online data storage, security, and sharing with third parties. Moreover online pharmacies has made it easier for patient's to access to narcotic drugs, anti-pregnancy kits. sedative antibiotics, dangerous and other medications making it difficult to track and trace. Moreover it is concerning that these E-Pharmacies were creating health data on their portals which threatens the privacy of the patients. Last year throughout the country members of FMRAI participated in subunit wise and state Jathas on medicine related demands one of which was opposing on line sales of medicines. The General Secretary AIOCD also participated virtually in the National Convention organised by FMRAI at Delhi and expressed his concern on the issue. We need to carefully monitor the steps of the Government on the matter and generate pan India movement movement to totally stop these illegal method of profiteering by the online players, ignoring precious health privacy and bypassing the laws of the country.

After years of strong follow up, the Industrial Tribunal gave verdict of reinstatement of Sudip Dey with 25% back wages for the period in consideration.

Glenmark udra Dutta, SPE Glenmark, a member of Murshidabad subunit of WBMSRU met with a ghastly accident, on duty and succumbed to injuries way back on 6th September, 2019. He was survived by his wife and little daughter. The company delayed in providing compensation and other benefits putting the family in severe hardship. state committee WBMSRU initiated legal proceedings and followed up with management. Management initially provided a paltry sum of Rs. 38,000/- and later on upon receiving legal notice provided additional amount of Rs. 13.36.000/- as insurance benefits to the family., WBMSRU will remain with the family till all dues are settled by the company.
